We conducted our own experiments in the science area: investigating light and dark, air, water, bubbles and motion. We painted magnets and a real car in the art zone! Finally, we used our imagination in the village to take on roles such as Fire Fighters, Construction Workers, Hairdressers, and Shop Workers. We had lots of fun and enjoyed it so much that the request came "Please can we come back tomorrow!"









Y6 Workshops

Over the past two weeks Year 6 have been really busy with two different workshops. The first workshop was about gangs and keeping safe in the community; the children learnt about being brave and confident in their choices and not giving in to peer pressure. The second workshop was with students from the University of Manchester. The children completed activities linked to their physical and mental health. This involved exercises, learning about the quantity of sugar in different drinks and analysing photos with and without filters to remind the children that not everything we see online is real.

On Tuesday, Year 1 went on a trip to Weaver Hall to learn all about the Great Fire of London and Samuel Pepys. We learnt so much about the life of people in 1666 and we made wattle and daub walls, fire marks and tussie mussies! 
