

Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has been Neurodiversity week. Neurodiversity refers to the way the brain works and interprets information. Estimates suggest that around 1 in 7 of the UK population is neurodivergent, meaning that the brain functions, learns and processes information differently to someone who is neurotypical. Neurodivergence can include ADD, ADHD, autism, dyscalculia, dyslexia, dyspraxia, executive dysfunction, OCD, stammering, Tourette's, tics and stimming amongst others. Neurodivergent people often experience more than one of these conditions.

Neurodiversity Celebration Week provides an excellent opportunity to celebrate neurodiversity and facilitate a school ethos that values difference and fosters a culture of empathy and understanding.

We had a Neurodiversity assembly to celebrate on Tuesday. Earlier in the year we applied to receive a 'See Myself in Books-Neurodiverse book collection' from 'Read Manchester'. We received 35 books a few months ago and we have added them to our KS1 and KS2 libraries. We believe that books are a great way to raise awareness and improve understanding of different experiences. Books can be a helpful tool in opening children up to different realities and perspectives and help to counter misconceptions. They can also help children to feel seen and understood. Free School Meals

Please note the below information regarding Free School Meals (FSM) transitional protection.

FSM transitional protection is coming to an end on 31st March 2025, and any pupils identified as eligible before this date will be covered until the end of the school phase. We would encourage you to ensure all pupils' eligibility is therefore reviewed before this cut-off.

From 1 April 2025, the Government's transitional protection arrangements for means tested FSM will end. Any eligible claims confirmed from this date will no longer be protected.

This means any child:

- confirmed as eligible for FSMs from 1 April 2025 will not qualify for transitional protection and will be subject to ongoing checks to confirm continued eligibility.
- already confirmed as eligible (prior to 1 April 2025) will maintain their eligibility until the end of their current phase of education. At that point, they will be re-assessed for their eligibility status e.g. year 6 moving into year 7 in September 2025.

If you already receive Free School Meals, you **DO NOT** need to do anything and your free school meals **WILL** continue but if you **DO NOT** currently receive free school meals, but think you may be eligible, please apply here before the end of the month: <u>https://www.manchester.gov.uk/info/500186/education_benefits/7355/free_school_meals</u>
